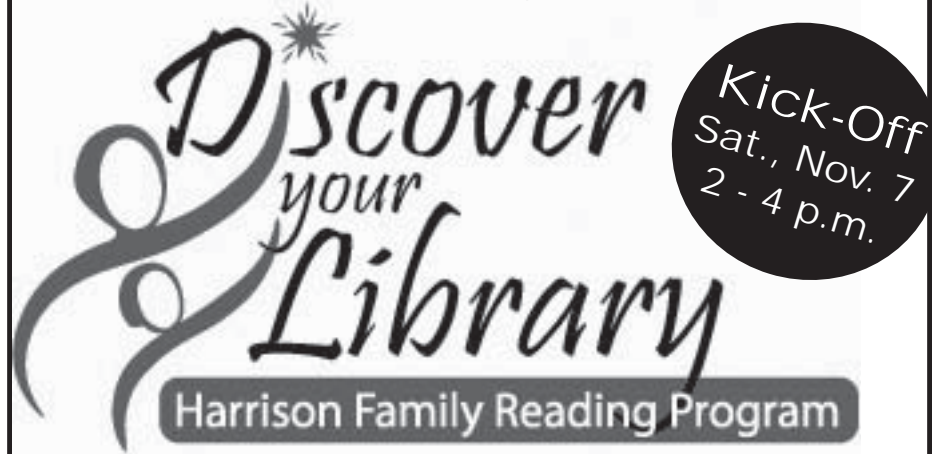


Community Event
