Casablanca (DVD)

Night club proprietor Rick encounters his long lost love and her Resistance-leader husband in Nazi-occupied North Africa.

Great Dictator (DVD)

Chaplin portrays a modest unassuming proprietor of a small barber shop in the Jewish ghetto Tomania who is mistaken for the country's maniacal dictator, Adenoid Hynkel.

Berga: Hitler's GI Death Camp (YouTube)

When Americans think soldiers and the Holocaust, they envision soldiers liberating death camps, not as victims of the Nazis. But in a place called Berga, American POWs became just that, working and dying as slave laborers in one of Hitler's most secretive concentration camps.

Home of the Brave: When Southbury Said NO to the Nazis (YouTube)

The film recollects a time in 1937 when the German-American Bund bought land in Southbury with plans to build a Hitler-Youth style camp. The residents of the small town chose to find a way to stop it from happening.

I'm Still Here (DVD)

Brings to life the diaries of young people who wit life the diaries of young people who witnessed first-hand the horrors of the Holocaust.

The Path to Nazi Genocide (YouTube)

This film examines the Nazis' rise and consolidation of power in Germany. Using rare footage, the film explores their ideology, propaganda, and persecution of Jews and other victims.

The Roosevelts: An Intimate History (DVD)

Profiles Theodore, Franklin, and Eleanor Roosevelt, three members of the most prominent and influential family in American politics.

Race (DVD)

Jesse Owens' quest to become the greatest track and field athlete in history launches him onto the world stage of the 1936 Olympics, where he faces off against Adolf Hitler's vision of Aryan supremacy.

The War (DVD)

Tells the story of ordinary people in four quintessentially American towns and examines the ways in which the Second World War touched the lives of every family on every street in every town in America.
